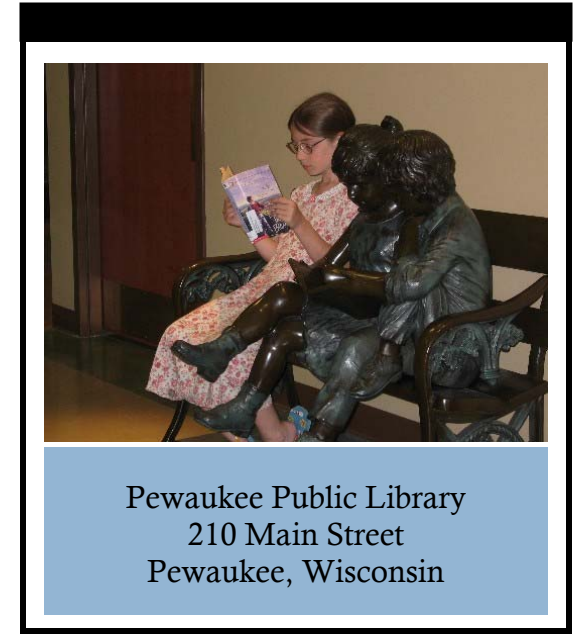

### How?
