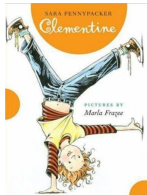
Agnes Parker: Keeping Cool in Middle School

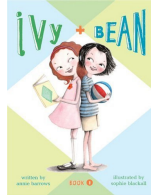

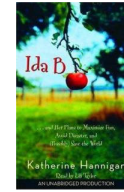

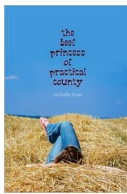
When the family's drugstore is failing, seventh-grader Lucy uses her problem solving talents to come up with solution that might rescue the business, along with helping the environment.

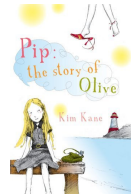
Popularity Papers by Amy Ignatow

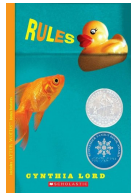
The Reinvention of Moxie Roosevelt by Elizabeth Cody Kimmel
