




Swindle



by Shannon Messenger



by Gary Paulsen



by Margi Preus






Breaking Stalin's Nose



by Kate Beasley



by Dusti Bowling


A year after the death of her mother in a restaurant shooting, Nora is left struggling to stay alive when a climbing trip with her father goes terribly wrong.

by Sheela Chari


After kids start disappearing from their school, Mars Patel and his friends investigate and find that all clues point to an eccentric tech genius, who also happens to be Mars' hero.

by Jeanne DuPrau



by Chris Grabenstein


