reality is a lie - and the truth is out of reach.

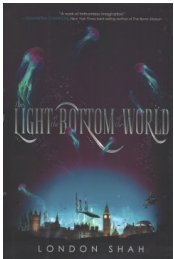


The memory index

name.

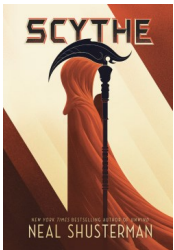


Brave new girl

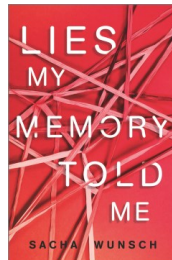
her identicals will be destroyed.

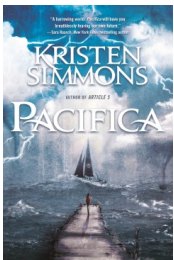


Lies my memory told me

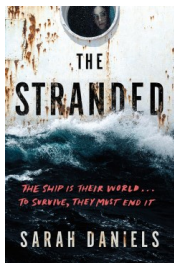
humanity into flesh-eating monsters.

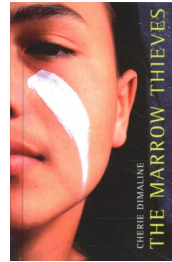


The stranded

dreams to the rest of the world

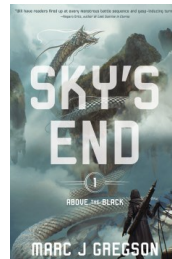


Ruinsong

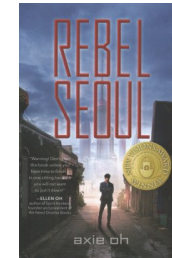
In a future where online comments are monitored by the Hive and are met with terrible consequences, Cassie is forced to go on the run after she posts an edgy joke.
