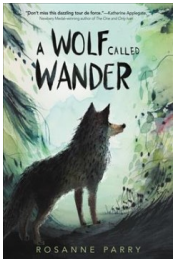

by Rosanne Parry

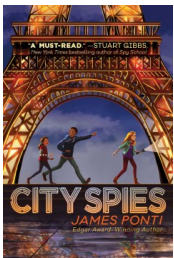

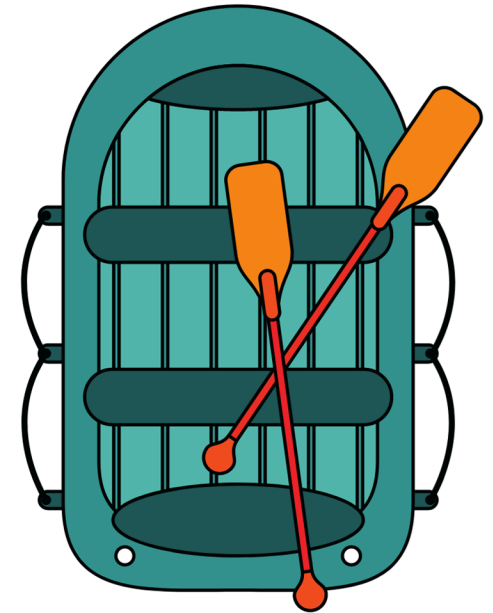


City spies

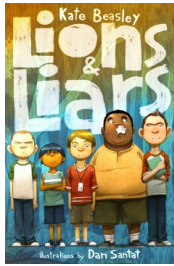

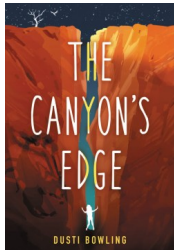

ever known is lost.

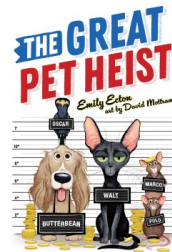


The unexplainable disappearance of Mars Patel

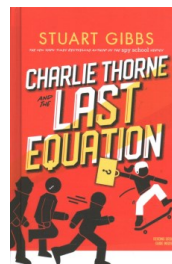


The boy who met a whale

discover it and unlock the solution to harnessing energy.

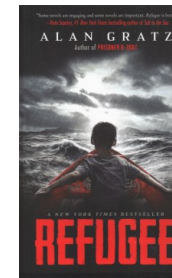


The last last-day-of-summer
