Swift, who has a penchant for mischief, decides to become a detective and solve this mysterious case.

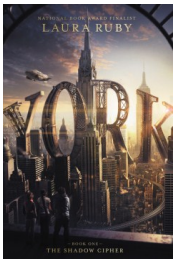


The Sherlock society

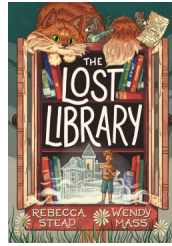
A debut entry in an alternate-history series depicts three kids who try to solve a modern-world puzzle and complete a treasure hunt laid into the streets and buildings of New York City.

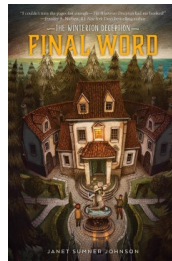
about to change.

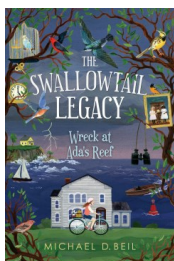


The cookie crumbles

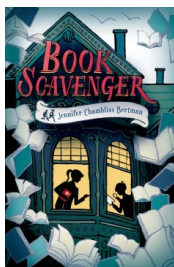
judges collapses after sampling her showpiece.

series.

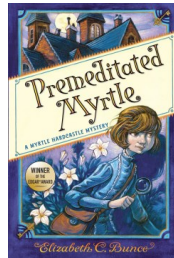


To catch a thief

stray dog she's fallen in love with.

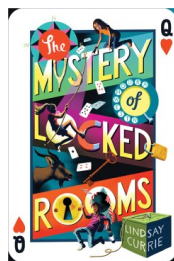


Premeditated Myrtle

to justice.

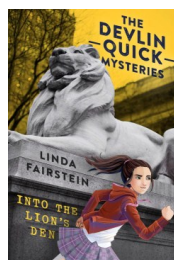


The mystery of locked rooms

With her family on the verge of losing their home, Sarah searches for a rumored treasure inside an abandoned funhouse which is unlike any escape room she's

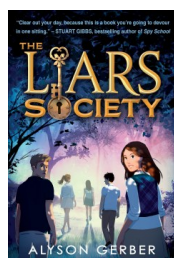
ever attempted.

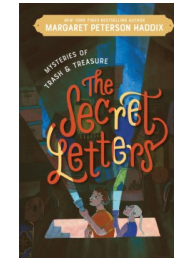


The liars society

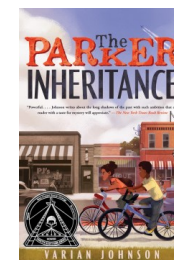
learns the lessons of the Cherokee storytellers.
