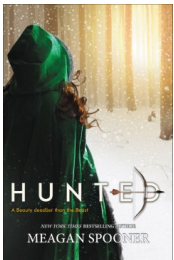
Lorelai's heart.

by Gena Showalter

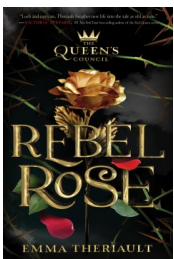

by White, Kiersten

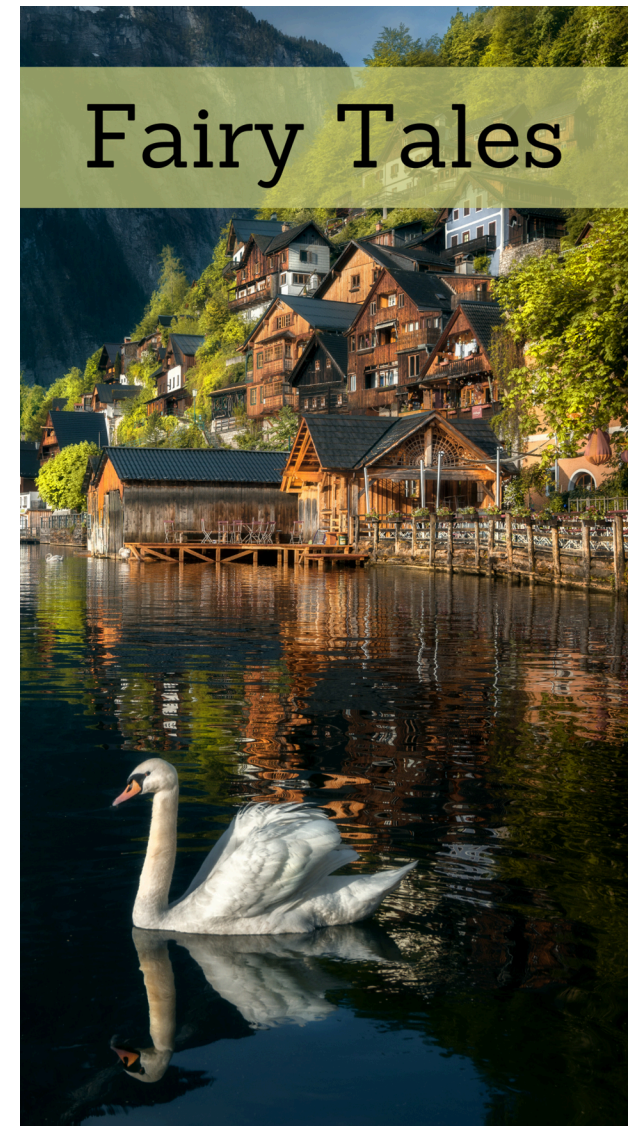

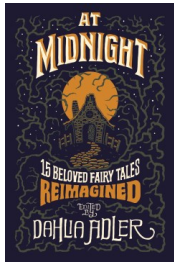

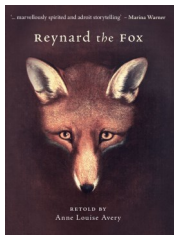


Red Hood

Courtoys the Hound, and dark and dangerous Isengrim the Wolf—to escape the gallows?

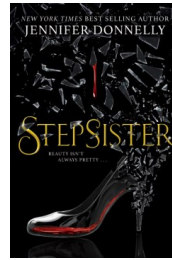


Cinderella is dead

by Elliott, David

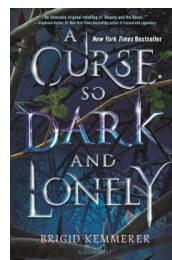

by June, Brandie

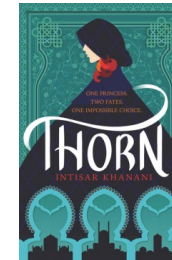

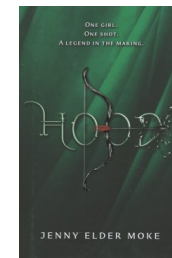


Six crimson cranes
