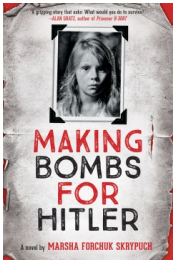


Salt to the sea

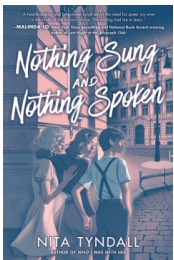
children to make bombs for the German army.

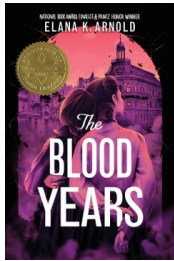

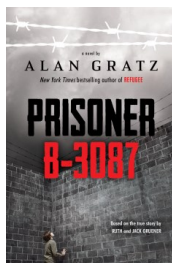


Trajectory

before she can do that, she must unlock an even bigger mystery: herself.

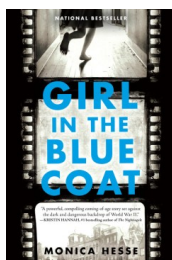


Prisoner B-3087
