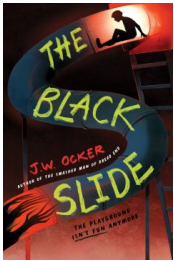

A young boy is imprisoned by a witch in a New York apartment and must tell her a new scary story each night in order to stay alive.

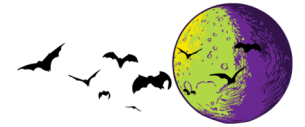


Ghost squad

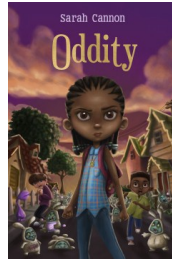
interested in preserving historic homes on the island.

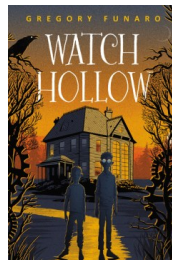


What lives in the woods
