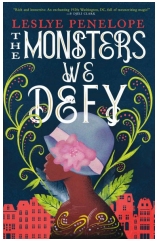


The list : a novel

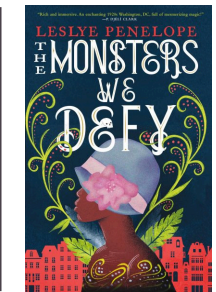
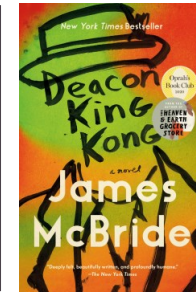
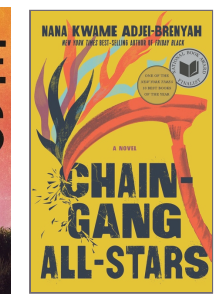
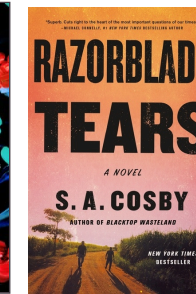
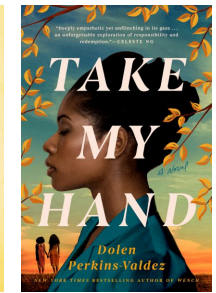
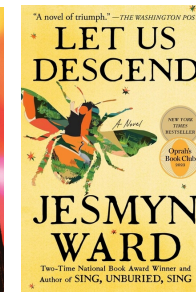
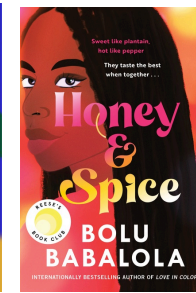
Black cake : a novel

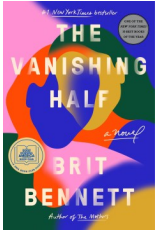

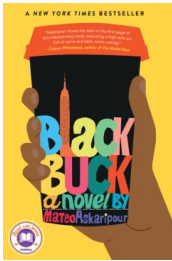

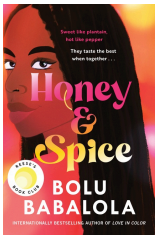

by Mateo Askaripour

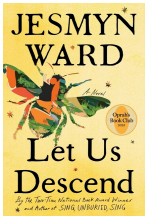

by Zora Neale Hurston

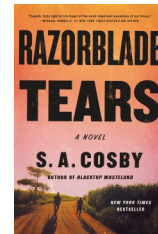

by S. A. Cosby

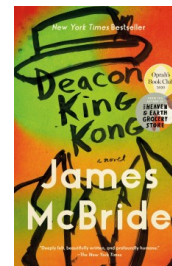
