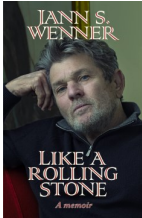

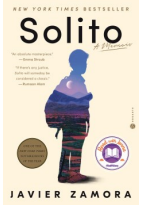

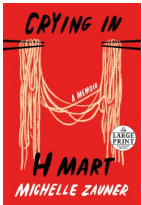
The *Rolling Stone Magazine* founder, co-editor and publisher offers a once-in-a-generation memoir from the beating heart of classic rock and roll.

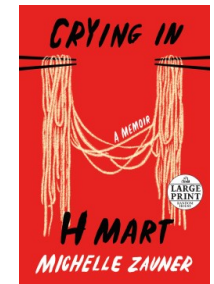
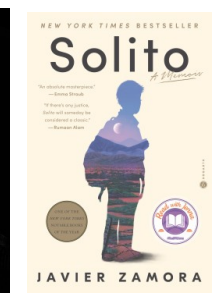
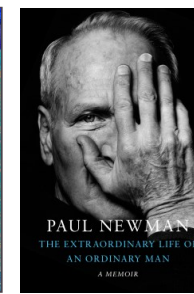
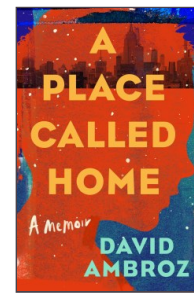
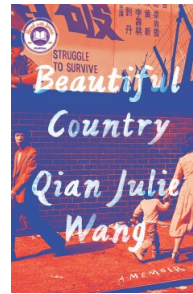
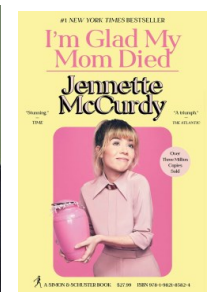
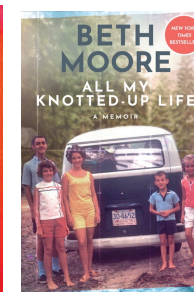
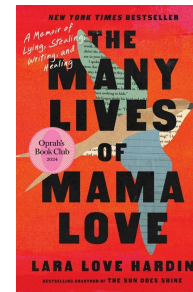
Crying in H Mart : a memoir

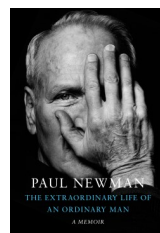


All my knotted-up life : a memoir

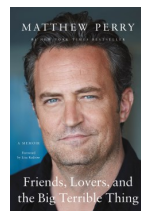
