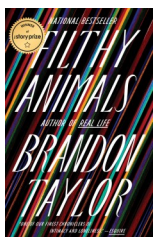


## Night of the living rez

by Brandon Taylor

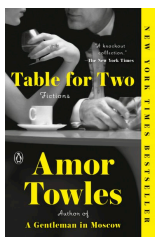

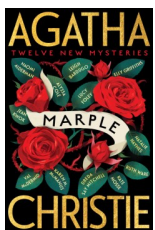




## Old babes in the wood : stories

by Margaret Atwood

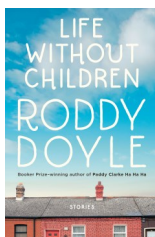

by Agatha Christie, among others.

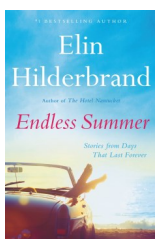

by Lily King

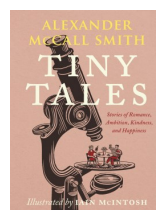
