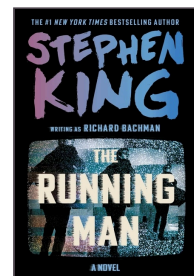
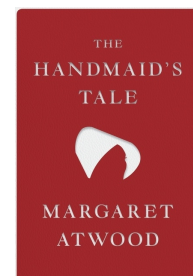
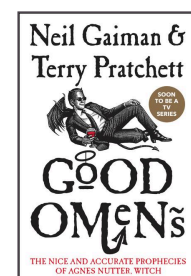
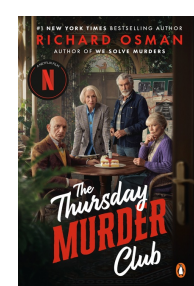
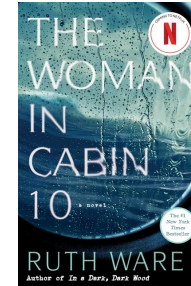
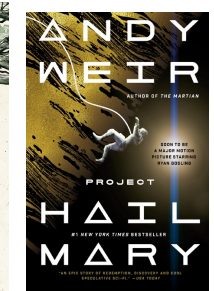
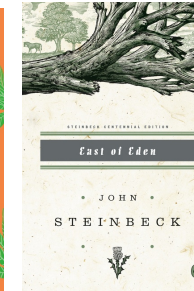
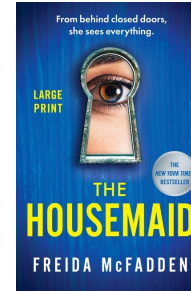
Frankenstein, or, The modern Prometheus

by Freida McFadden

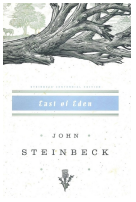

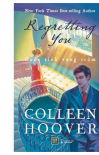
